Trail Map

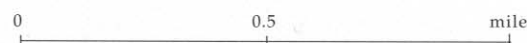

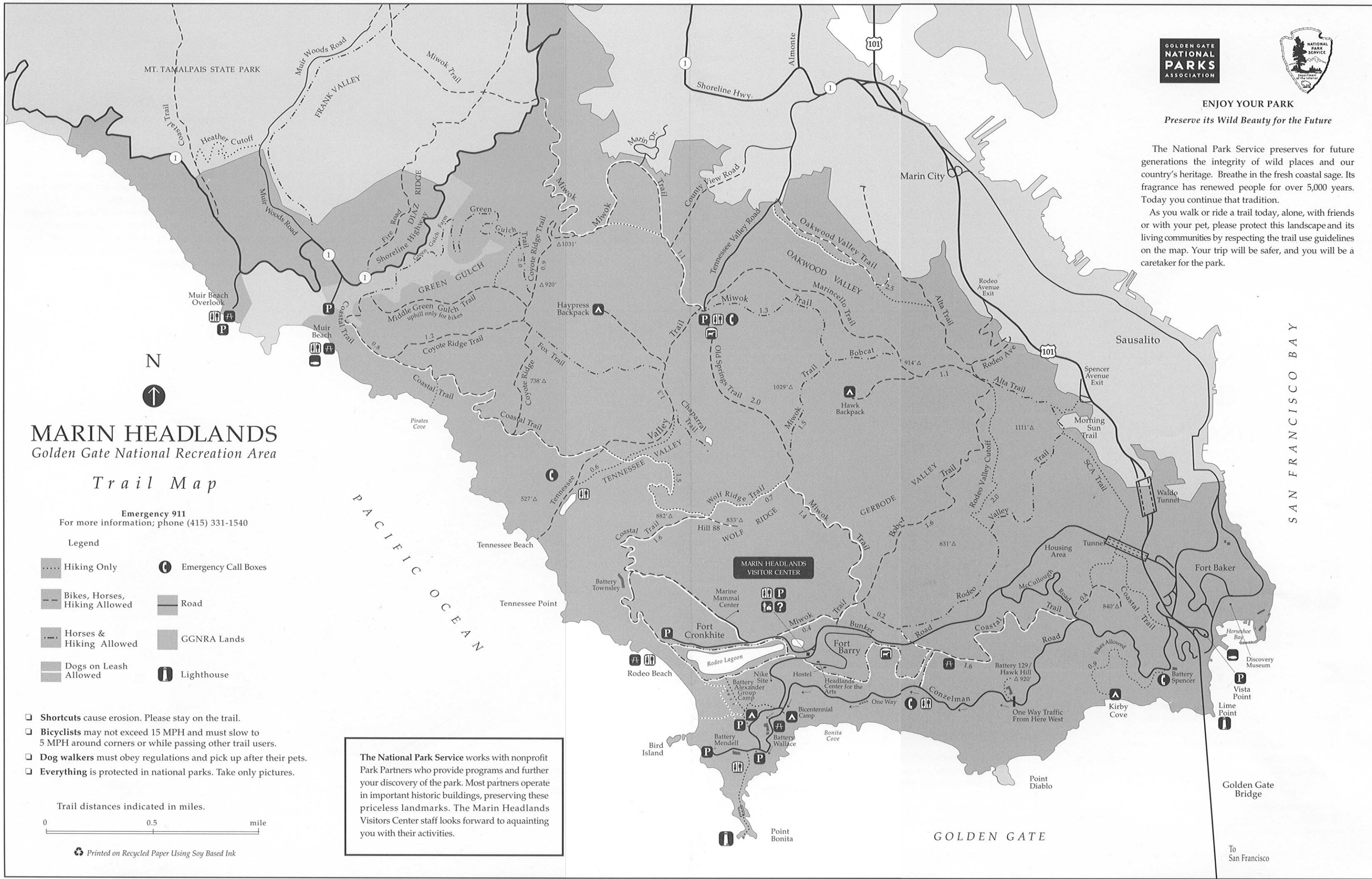
- Shortcuts cause erosion. Please stay on the trail.
